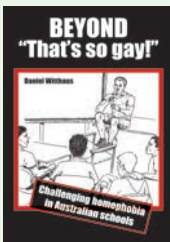


STOP THE STRESS IN SCHOOLS

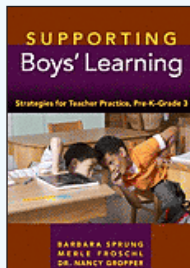
