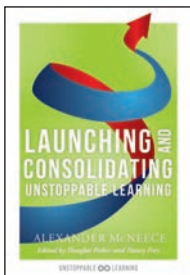

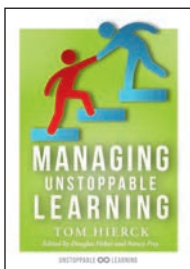


LAUNCHING AND CONSOLIDATING UNSTOPPABLE LEARNING

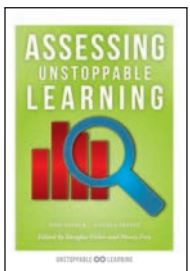


MANAGING UNSTOPPABLE LEARNING
