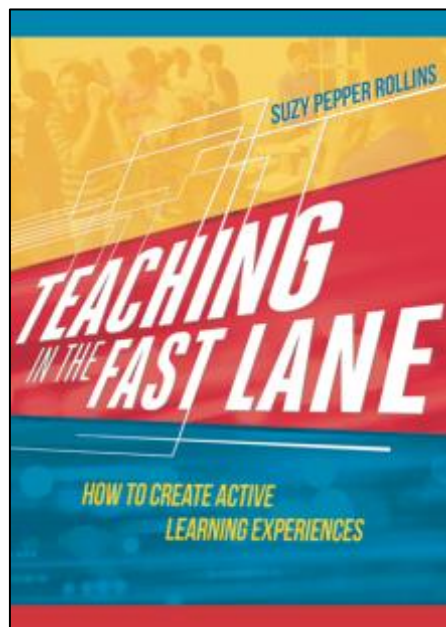


# Teaching in the Fast Lane: How to Create Active Learning Experiences

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## Summary
