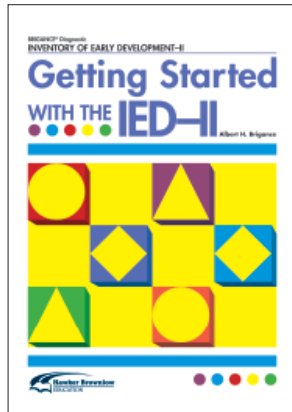

Brigance – Getting Started With the IED-II

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Summary:

Getting Started with the Early Development-II is used in early childhood programs, preschools and day-care centres, for infants and children below the age of 7. The IED-II is widely used in curricular planning, assessment of school readiness skills and the development of Individual Educational Programs, helping identify “at risk” infants and preschoolers and identifying children’s strengths and weaknesses, and is useful for communicating with parents, diagnosing delays, disabilities, giftedness and other exceptionalities. It can be administered by teachers, developmental and school psychologists, and other childhood professionals. It produces a complete range of information on their developmental progress, through distinct skill sequences as demonstrated under real-life, everyday conditions.
