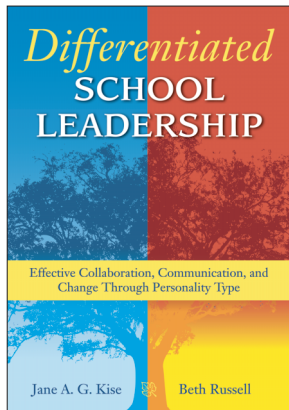


Differentiated School Leadership Effective Collaboration, Communication, and Change Through Personality Type
