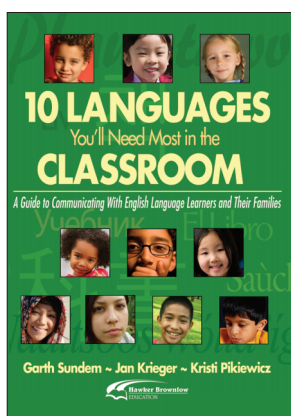


Ten Languages You'll Need Most in the Classroom
