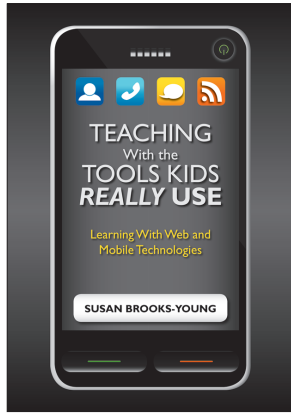


Teaching With the Tools Kids Really Use: Learning With Web and Mobile Technologies
