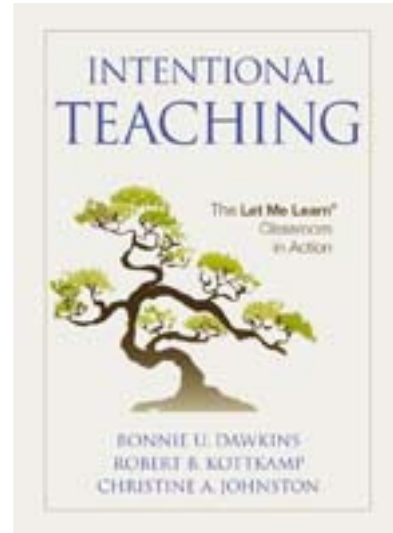


Intentional Teaching
