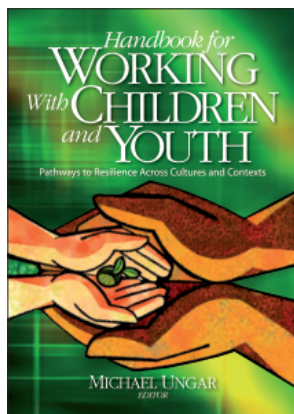


Hawker Brownlow Education Handbook for Working With Children and Youth
