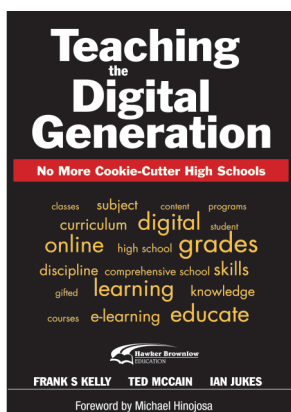


# Teaching the Digital Generation: No More Cookie-Cutter High Schools

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## Summary:

Teaching the Digital Generation examines how educators can address the learning needs of secondary students immersed in a digital world by designing and implementing new instructional models and technology infrastructure. The authors explore ten alternative high school models that address twenty-first-century skills such as critical thinking, problem-solving and digital literacy, and pose five critical considerations that inform their approach.
