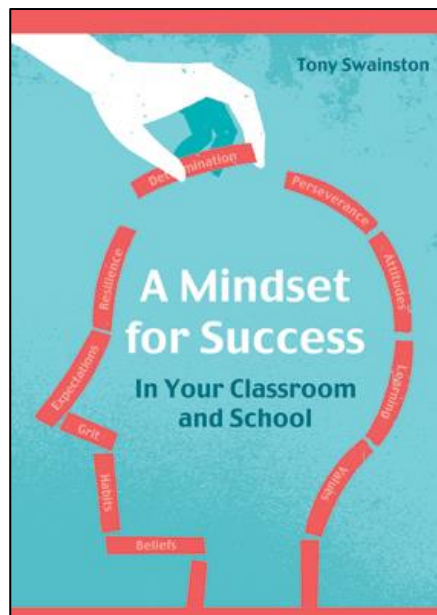


A Mindset for Success: In Your Classroom and School
