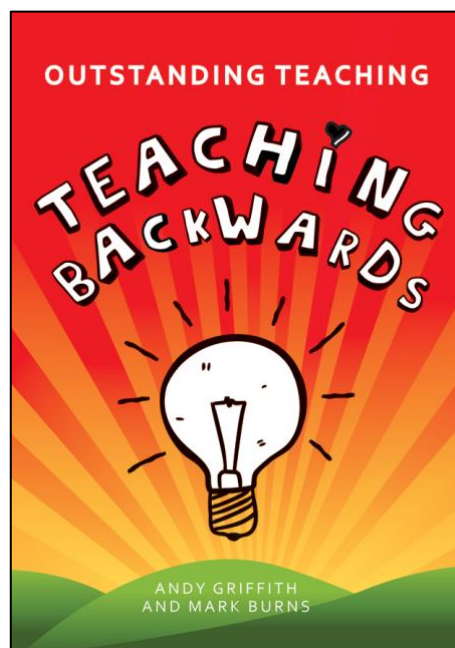


Outstanding Teaching: Teaching Backwards
