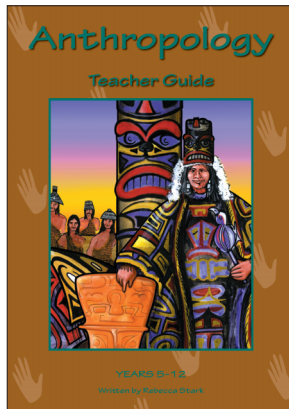

Summary:

Anthropology is the study of humankind, examining the evolution of the human species and its cultures. Mind-stimulating activities, based upon information given and outside research, encourage critical and creative thinking. These self-directed activities emphasise higher-level thinking skills and are keyed to Bloom's Revised Taxonomy. Students learn about human development and about the physical, social and cultural development of various societies. Concepts of social organisation are introduced: kinship groups, residence patterns, associations and marriage. Also covered are political organisation, ideology and religion. The Teacher Guide provide pre- and post-tests, quizzes, puzzles, a glossary and helpful background information.
