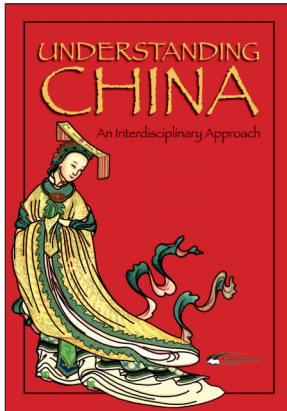


Understanding China: An Interdisciplinary Approach
