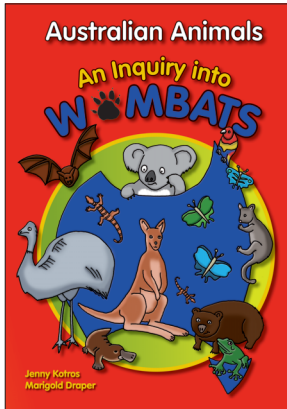

Summary:

The Inquiry Learning approach enables children to become independent thinkers and learners. The material in this book encourages children to develop a keen interest in Australian animals and the part that we can play in the preservation of their environment.

Engaging activities and experiences will lead the children to investigate the characteristics of the wombat. Students will find out about the type of environment the wombat needs for its wellbeing and survival. They will investigate possible threats to the wombat.

Children will learn about the interdependence of living things and what can be done to preserve wombats and their environments. They will make strong links between caring for the environment and the survival of Australian wildlife. Students will think of ways they can spread the knowledge they have gained, develop solutions to problems and put these into action.
