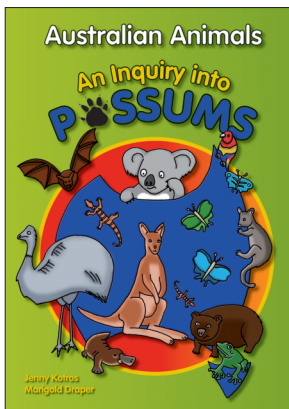

Summary:

The Inquiry Learning approach enables children to become independent thinkers and learners. The material in this book encourages children to develop a keen interest in Australian animals and the part that we can play in the preservation of their environment.

Engaging activities and experiences will lead the children to investigate the characteristics of the possum. Students will find out about the type of environment the possum needs for its wellbeing and survival. They will investigate possible threats to the possum.

Children will learn about the interdependence of living things and what can be done to preserve possums and their environments. They will make strong links between caring for the environment and the survival of Australian wildlife. Students will cover cross curricular subjects; Art, English, Technology, Maths, cross age tutoring as well as Thinking Strategies, Six Thinking Hats, Mind Maps and Graphic Organisers.
