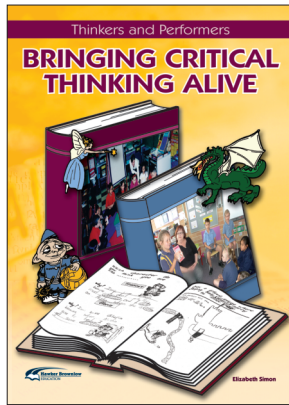


Thinkers and Performers: Bringing Critical Thinking Alive
