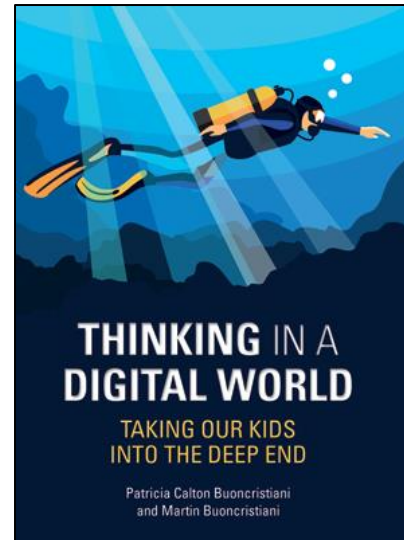


Thinking in a Digital World: Taking Our Kids into the Deep End
