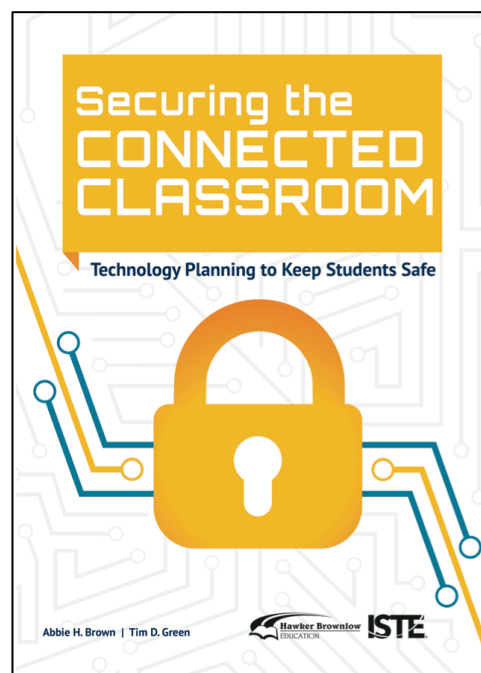


Securing the Connected Classroom: Technology Planning to Keep Students Safe
