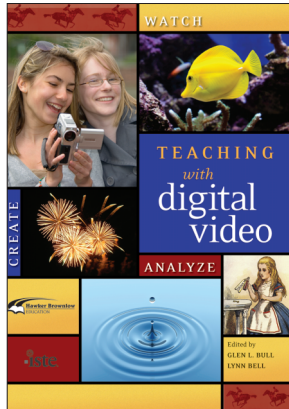


Teaching with Digital Video: Watch, Analyze, Create
