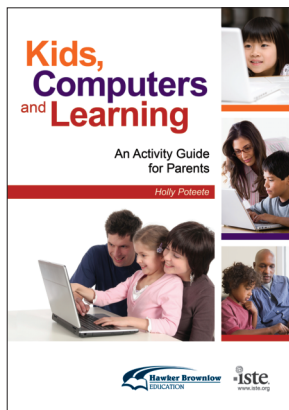


Kids, Computers and Learning

Summary:

Teaching your young children the technology skills they will need throughout their lives can seem like a daunting task for any parent – but it no longer has to be. This book contains lessons and activities that parents can use either as a supplement to school computer labs and information technology lessons, or in a more structured home learning environment.

Beginning with basic computer skills such as typing and recognising parts of the computer, your child will learn the skills they need in activities and lessons that are fun and engaging. Students learn common computer tasks: using Microsoft Office applications such as Microsoft Word and PowerPoint, and compiling spreadsheets with Excel; web browsers such as Internet Explorer or Firefox; multimedia and Web 2.0 tasks such as podcasting and RSS with programs like iTunes; online resources for web research; video sharing with Youtube; and other concepts such as blogging and wikis. Additionally, the book emphasises online safety with children and contains songs and stories to teach elements of safe internet usage.
