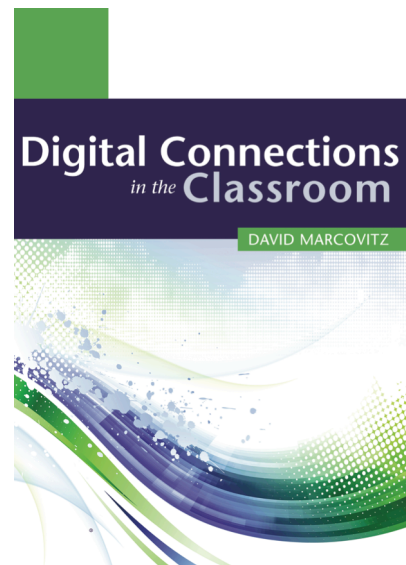


# Digital Connections in the Classroom
