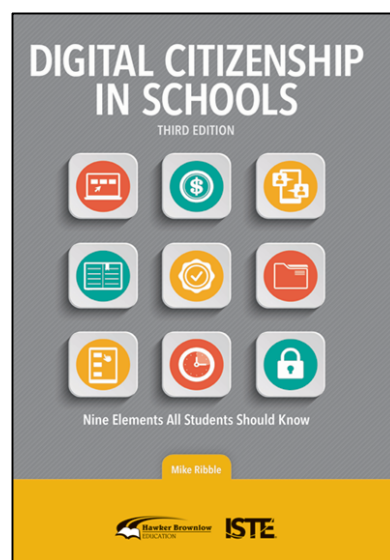


Digital Citizenship in Schools, 3rd Edition: Nine Elements All Students Should Know

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Summary
