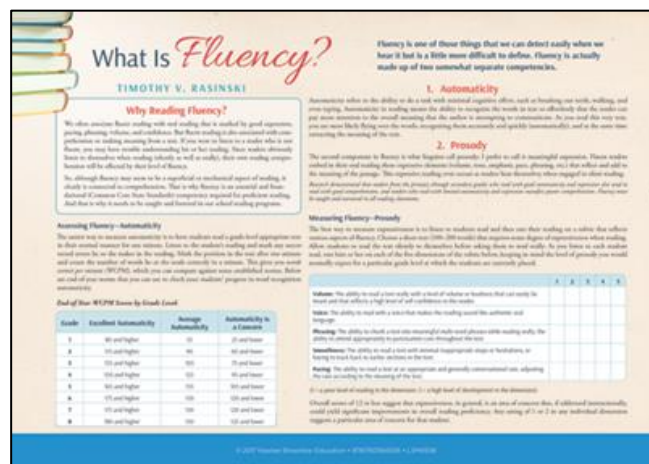

Summary

Fluency is much more than expression, pacing, volume and confidence. Students who read fluently are able to comprehend and take meaning from the text. Teaching this critical skill, a requirement of rigorous standards, calls for a multi-faceted approach, as outlined in this quick reference guide.
