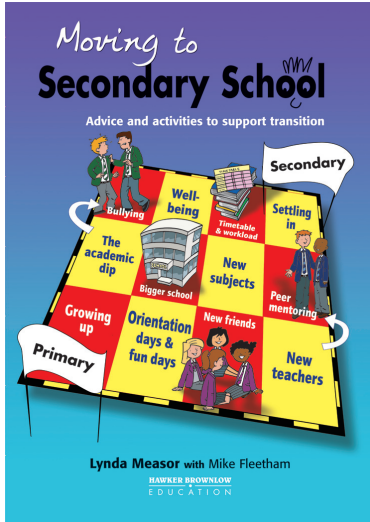

Summary:

Moving to Secondary School helps teachers to understand and ease children's anxieties and to focus on the positive. The book tackles worries about organisational aspects of secondary school life, such as school size, timetable and workload, as well as personal concerns about making friends, being bullied and getting on with teachers. It also considers how teaching differs between primary and secondary, and how special programmes can offer continuity in students' learning, while allowing for the discontinuity that signals children becoming more grown up.
