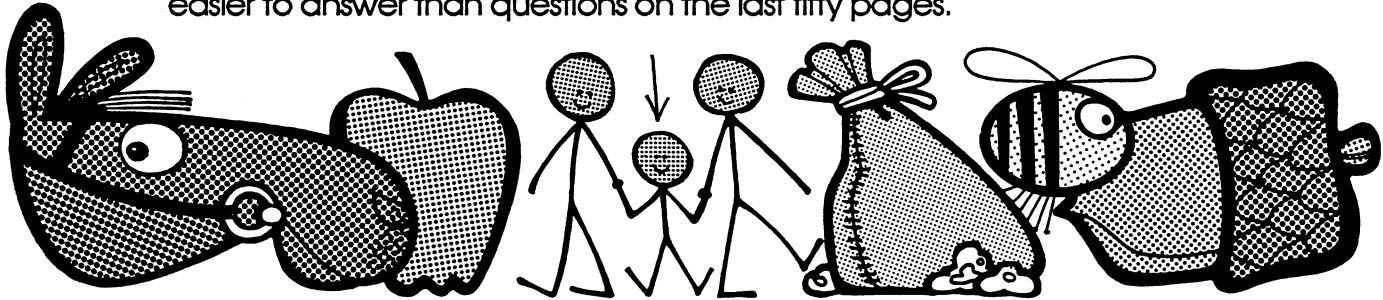


Introduction

This book is a collection of more than three hundred questions covering such topics as geography, government, grammar, history, literature, mathematics, music, science, and sports. It is intended for use in the classroom, at home, or anywhere children have empty minutes to fill, and should be ideal on rainy days, before recess, during parties, or while travelling.

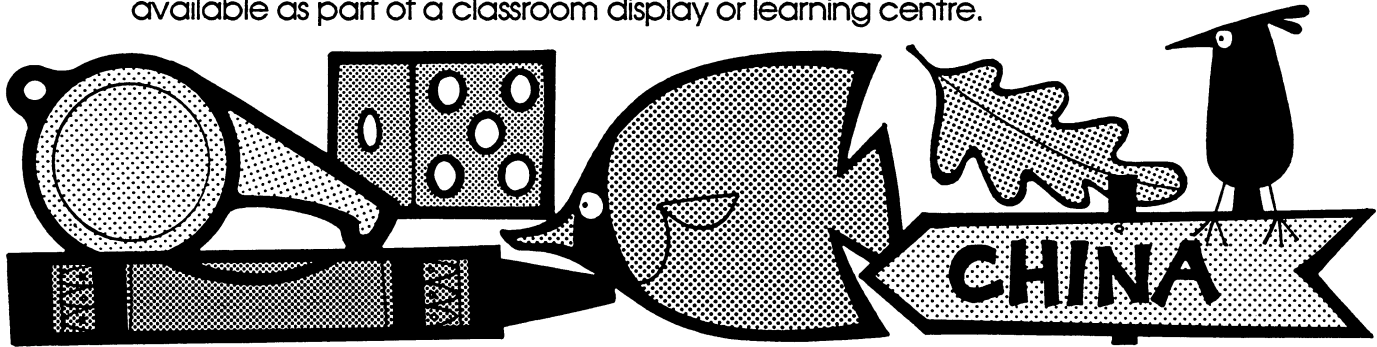
The questions have been placed two to a page. Questions on any one page cover different topics but are of a similar degree of difficulty. The pages have been arranged within the book so that the questions progress from easy through medium to hard. In general, questions on the first fifty pages should be easier to answer than questions on the last fifty pages.



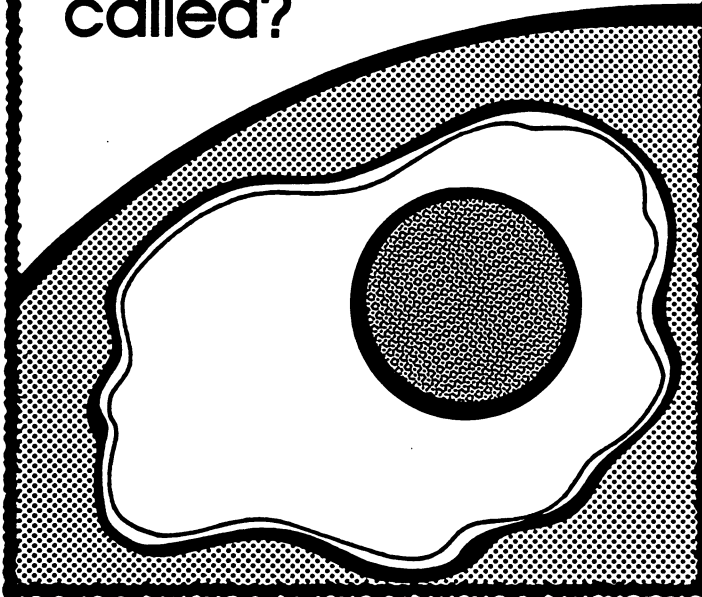
A Special Message to Teachers

The ways to use this book in your classroom are almost endless. To begin with, of course, you can open it to any page and ask a few questions to fill those last minutes before lunch or recess.

Or you can turn the questions into a **self-checking game**. Select pages on which the questions are appropriate for the year level you teach. Duplicate some of these pages and cut the questions apart. Glue each question to one side of a plain 10 cm by 15 cm index card. Glue or write the corresponding answer on the other side of the card. Laminate the cards and make them available as part of a classroom display or learning centre.
