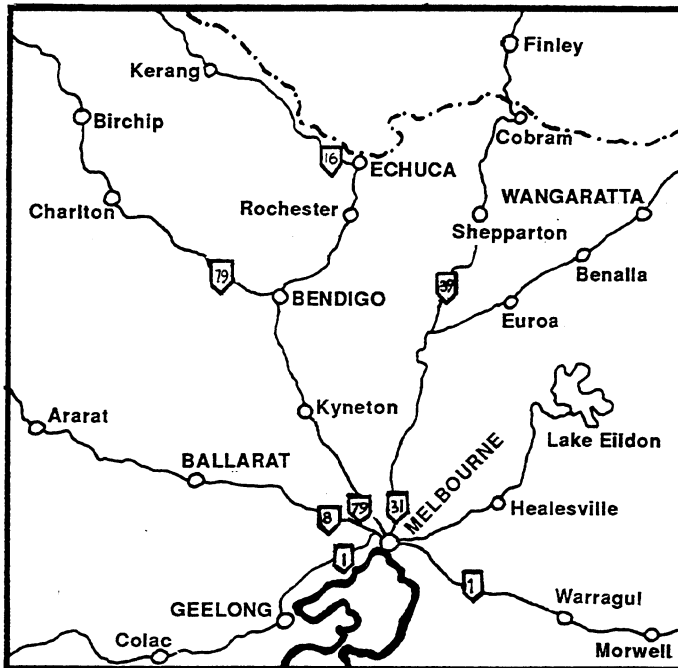
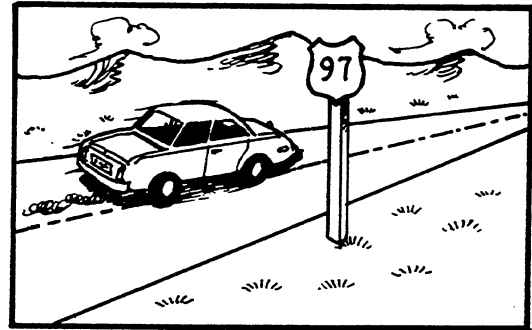


A Road Map

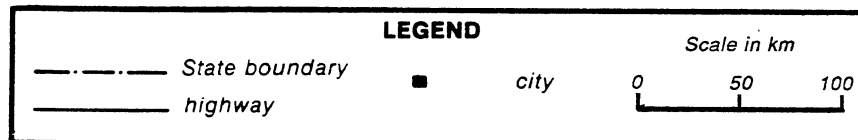


This is a **road map**.

NOTES FOR TEACHERS

BASIC MAP SKILLS copy masters present a systematic and sequential introduction to the understanding and use of maps at the intermediate grade level. They are designed for pupils who have no previous familiarity with maps. They can also be used as a review or supplement, or in conjunction with a unit on geography.

BASIC MAP SKILLS introduces the following concepts:

- What a map is, and what it's used for
- Directions: north, south, east, and west
- Determining relative distance and direction on a map
- Understanding and use of map symbols
- Directions: northeast, northwest, southeast, southwest
- Using a scale
- Application of skills to maps of real places

Use of BASIC MAP SKILLS copy masters may be self-contained, or co-ordinated with the use of other maps and globes in the classroom or school library. The teacher may run off multiple copies of each duplicating master in sequence as an activity for the entire class, or allow each pupil to work through the series at his or her own level of ability.
