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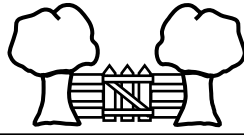
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## THE MYSTERY OF UNIT 13

Who lives in Unit 13? That's what the members of the Scallywags Club want to know!

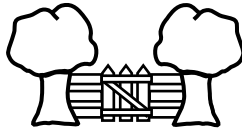

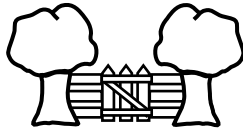
