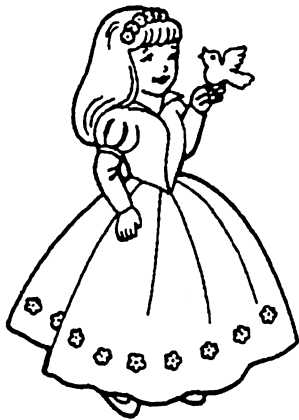

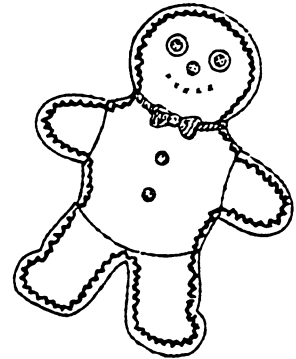


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Introduction

Literature Activities employs a multi-sensory approach to learning based on twelve popular children's fairy tales. This book incorporates a variety of activities to meet the needs and learning styles of young children. Many follow-up suggestions are listed and include the following:

(1) Extended Activities

- finger plays
- games, songs, and poems
- creative movement
- field trip suggestions
- choral reading
- skipping rope rhymes
- questioning techniques
- gross motor activities
- dramatic play
- show 'n' share ideas

(2) Art Activities

- stencils
- puzzles
- fingerpainting
- mobile
- play dough
- pins and brooches
- transfer prints
- shadow box
- wax crayon rubbings
- box characters

(3) Pencil and Paper Activities

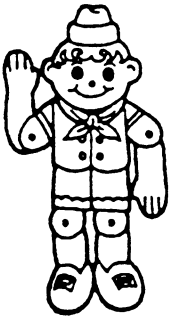
- mazes
- counting
- matching sets to numerals
- sequencing

Special Note:

Because some art projects in this book may present too much coloring for young children, the following options may be helpful.

- Outline the character.
- Color only certain items, e.g. the hat and shoes; specify which colors to use.
- Duplicate pattern pieces onto colored paper.
- Have children work as a group to complete one project.
- Glue fabric scraps, paper, glitter, beans, etc. to decorate a project.

Pinocchio

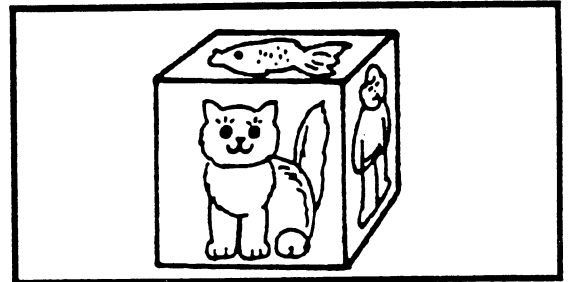


Kindly old Gepetto received a piece of wood from which he carved a marionette; he named the puppet Pinocchio. Pinocchio was very disrespectful and naughty - so naughty that Gepetto was arrested and Pinocchio was left to fend for himself. When Gepetto returned, he fixed Pinocchio up again but the puppet did not remain good for very long. Many adventures later Pinocchio finally learned that only by being good could he become a real boy.



Suggested Activities

Pinocchio Cube: Duplicate, color, and cut out the six pictures on page 11. Get a square white box and tape all the edges closed. Glue one picture on each side of the cube. Each child takes a turn rolling the cube. The child names and then describes the character.



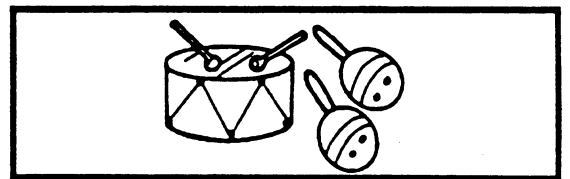

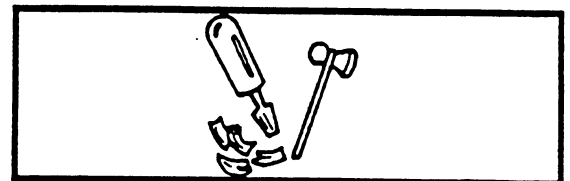
Mirror Puppets: Two children face each other. One child is appointed to begin the mirror exercise. This child slowly moves his/her body in motions depicting puppet movements controlled by strings. The other child “mirrors” the exact same motions at the same time.



Playing Instruments To Songs: Children beat, shake, rattle, or jingle homemade or commercial instruments to the beat and rhythm of the Pinocchio songs.

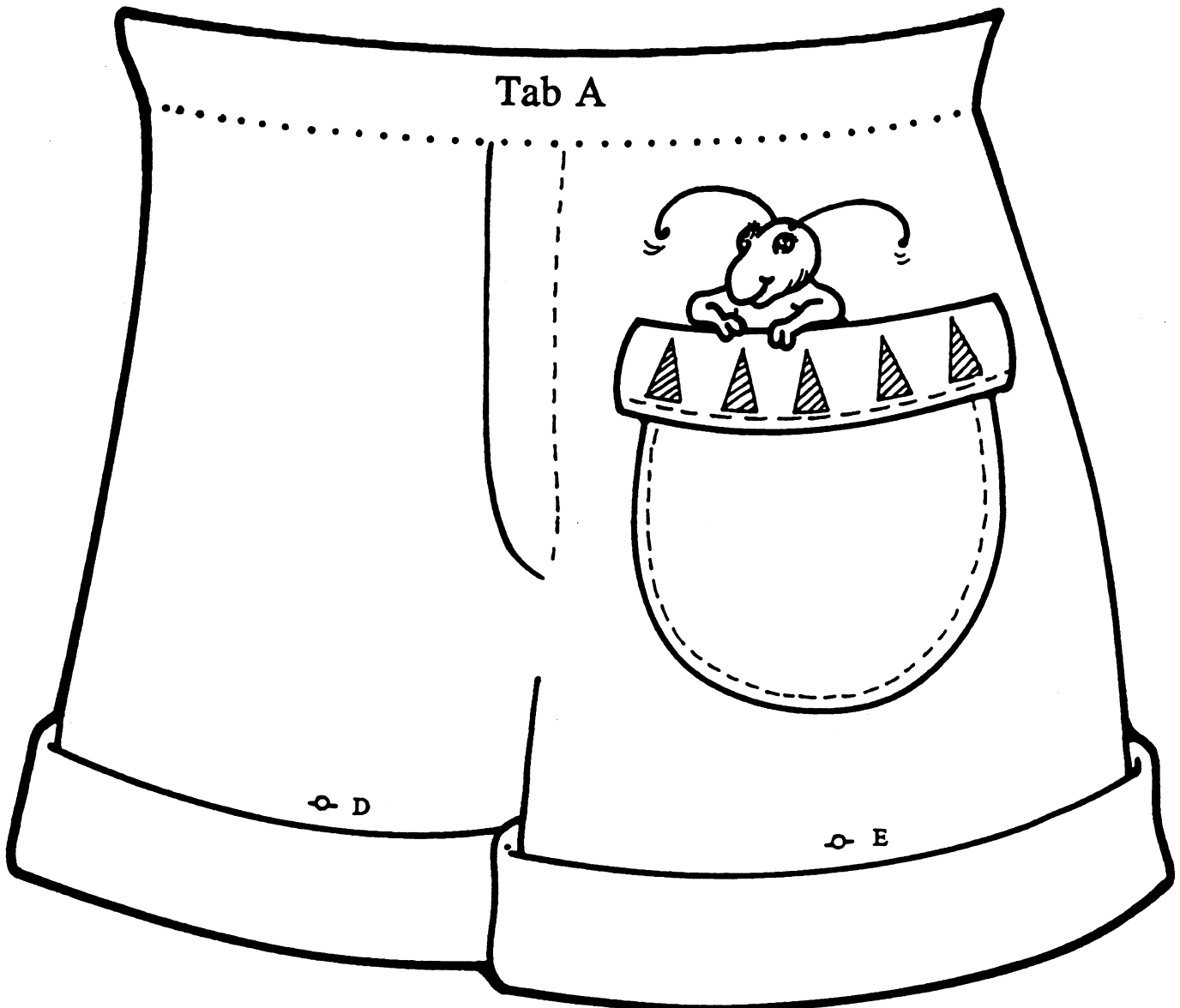


Learn About Wood Carvers: Learn how the wood carver works, the tools he uses, how he cuts wood, the type of ornaments, figures and objects a wood carver can make.



Pinocchio

1. Color and cut out Pinocchio character (pages 4-7).
2. Glue Pinocchio's top half of body, (page 5), to his pants, Tab A, (page 4).
3. Punch out holes B-E. Attach character's arms and legs to body with paper fasteners. Match the letters.
