BIOGRAPHY

A biography is the story of the life (or some part of it) of a person, written by another person.

A good biographer researches the life of the person being studied, in depth, so that a feeling for the person being described, is developed.

The biography is then written in a way that highlights the most interesting aspects of the person's life, to the eventual readers.



Choose somebody you respect or admire, either a person you know or somebody famous, whom you may not have met.

If you know the person, interview them and others close to them to develop a close understanding of their life. If you do not know the person, read all of the books you can about the person and their life, until you know them thoroughly.

Now plan and write your biography. If possible use a word processor so that you can bind the finished work and add it to the library, for others to read.
