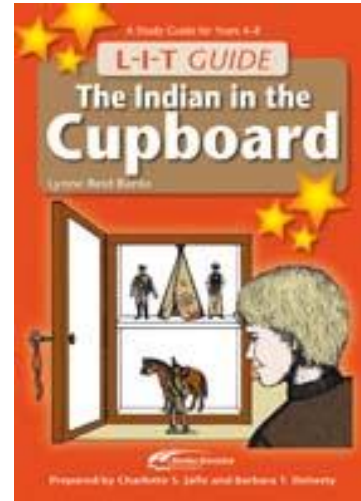


# The Indian in the Cupboard
