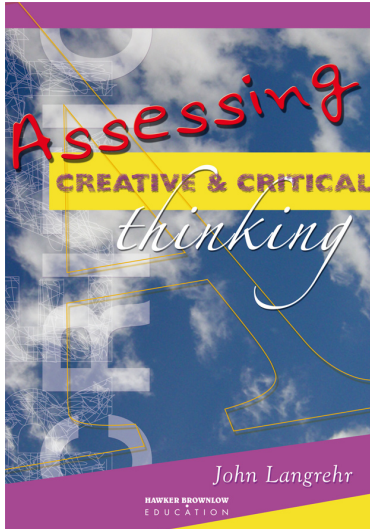

## ***Assessing Creative and Critical Thinking***

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<b>Category:</b>	Thinking Skills

### **Summary:**

Critical and creative thinking are two of the most vital forms of thinking. Both of these can be improved with instruction such as a thinking skills program; however, there is difficulty in objectivity testing higher forms of thinking because questions that assess critical and creative thinking usually have more than one correct answer. This form of assessment demands that learners ask themselves questions and form original ideas rather than just recalling previously stored facts.
