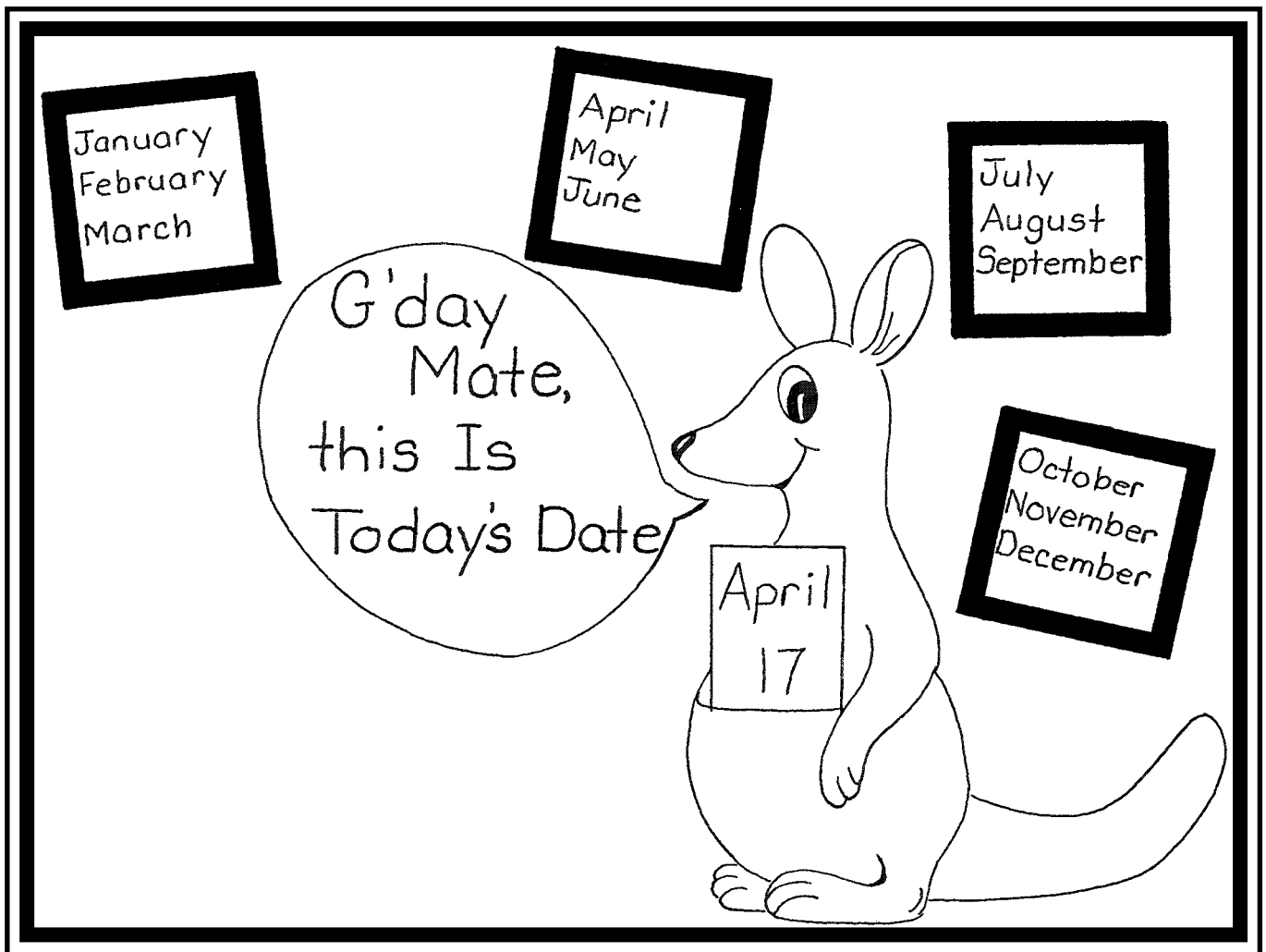


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# G'day Mate, this Is Today's Date



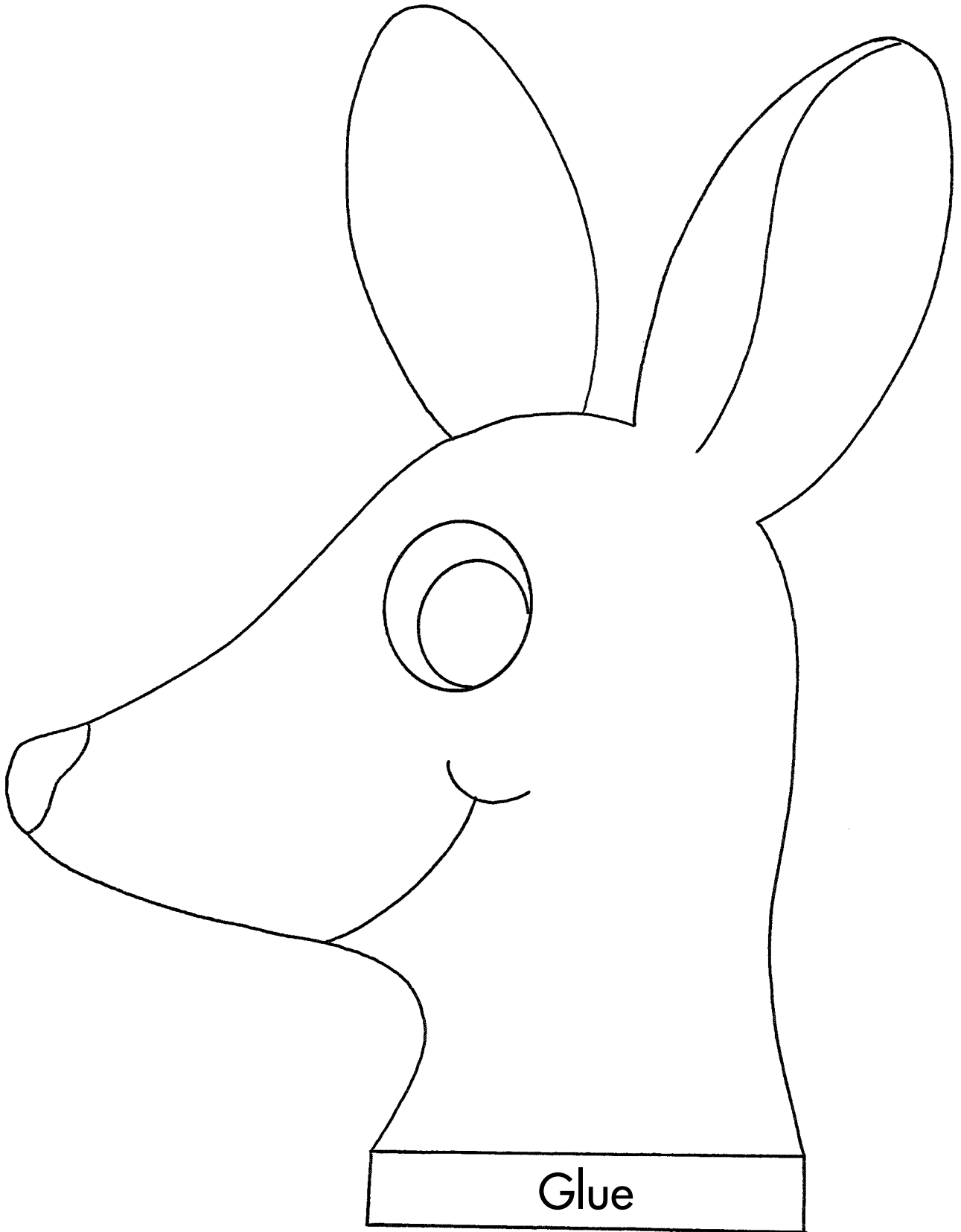
## Materials:

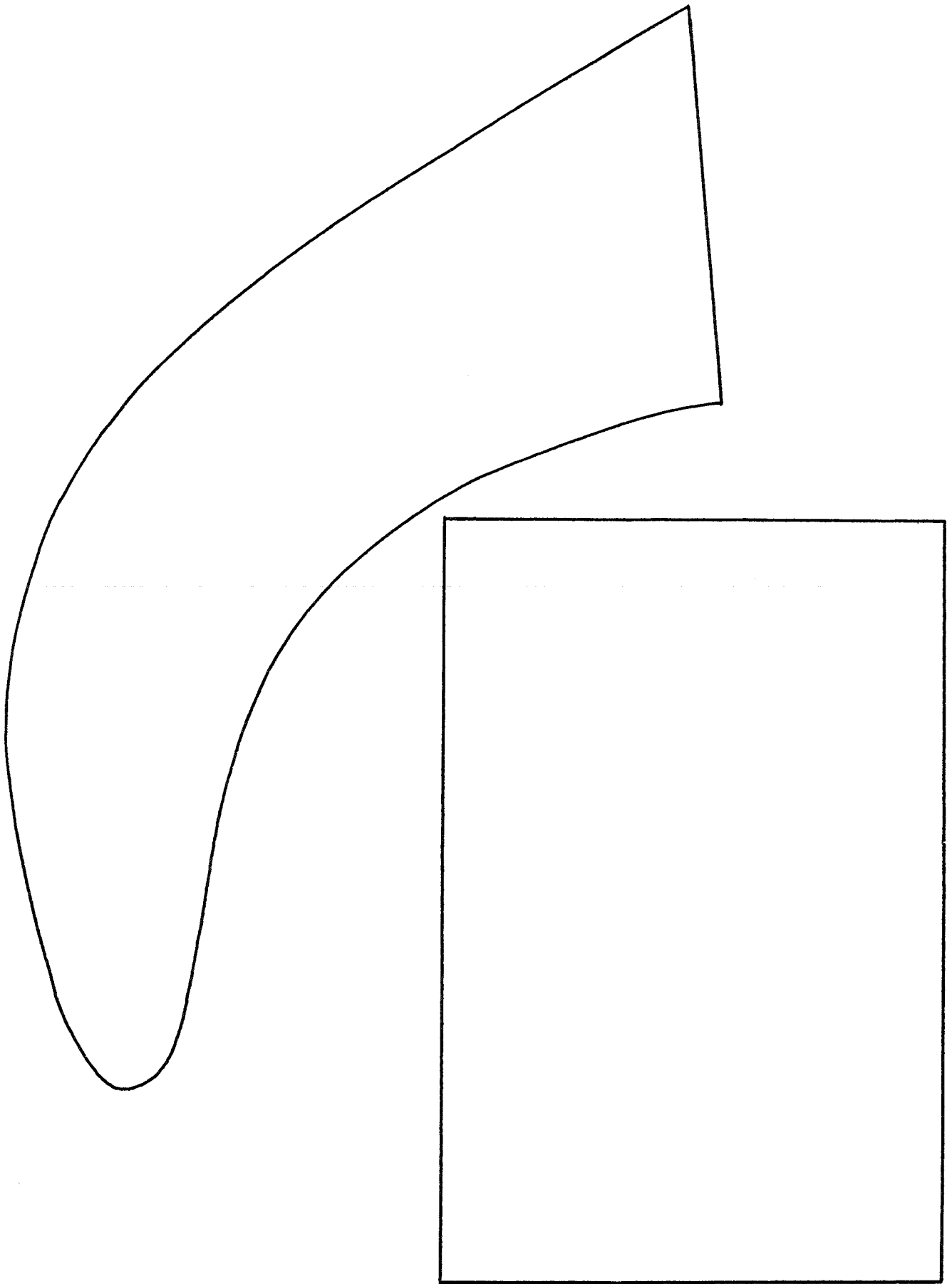
- Construction paper
- Crayons
- Textas
- Glue
- Scissors

## Construction:

1. Cover the bulletin board with green paper.
2. Copy, colour and cut out the kangaroo pattern on pages 6–8. Glue the head and tail to the kangaroo's body. Cut along the dotted line to make a pouch. Attach the kangaroo to the bulletin board.
3. Use a texta to write 'G'day Mate, this Is Today's Date' on a large piece of paper and attach it next to the kangaroo.
4. Write the months of the year on several pieces of construction paper and attach them to the bulletin board.
5. Make thirty-one copies of the card on page 7. Make one card for each day of the month by writing the name of the current month across the top of the card and the numbers of the dates on the bottom. The cards should read 'April 1, April 2', etc. Each day select a student to choose a card with the appropriate date and to place it in the kangaroo's pouch.

*Hint: To use the bulletin board for more than one month, write the name of the current month on a piece of construction paper and attach it next to the kangaroo's pouch. Then number the cards 1–31. At the end of the month, change the month on the bulletin board.*
