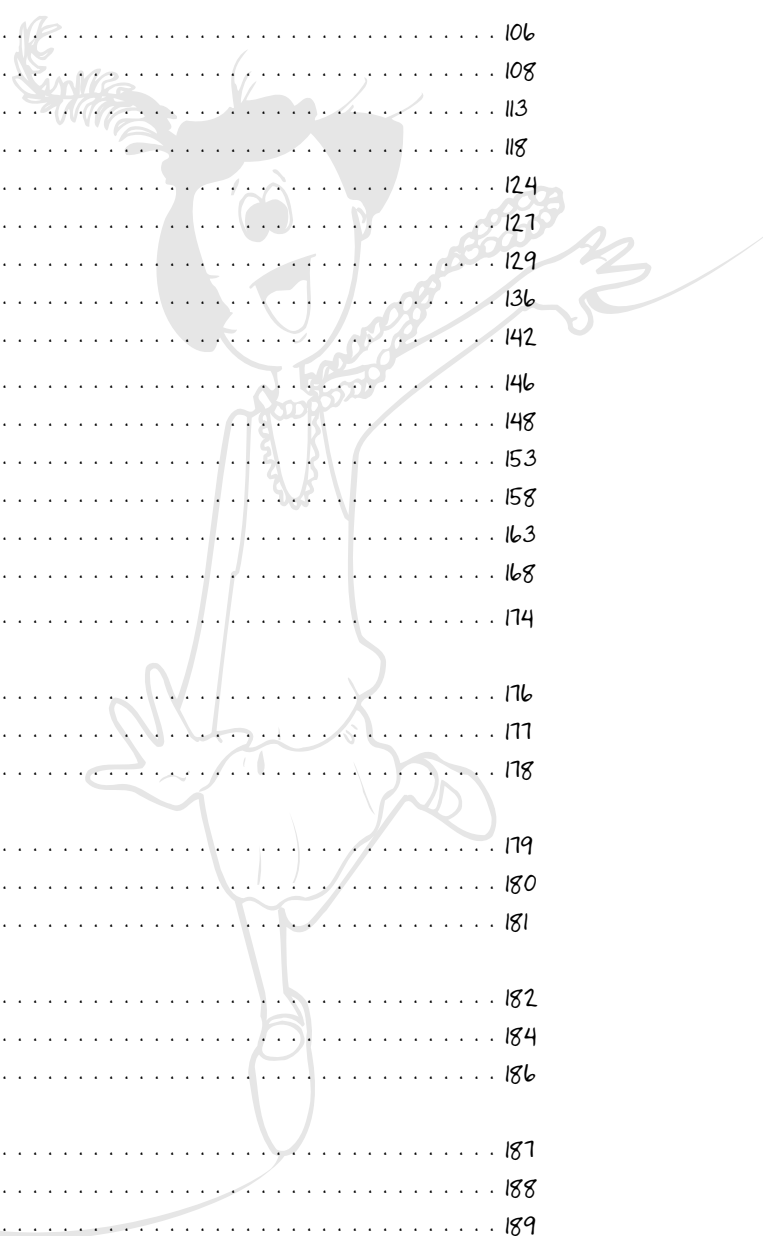

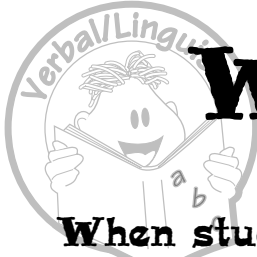

Word Smart

When students use their Verbal/Linguistic intelligence, they are being “Word Smart”.

Students show they are Word Smart when they are good at reading, writing, speaking and listening. They use language to express ideas, experiences and images.

Being word smart includes enjoying reading, telling stories and jokes, and having a good vocabulary. Word smart also includes having a sensitivity to the order and meaning of words and also their sounds, rhythms and inflections.

We show this intelligence as we write stories, poems, jokes, letters, and journals. We are also Word smart when we show an interest in debates, storytellers, class discussions and oral presentations.

People who put their Word Smarts to work include authors, poets, public speakers, lawyers, salespeople, actors/actresses, comedians, journalists and politicians.

We are Word Smart when we:

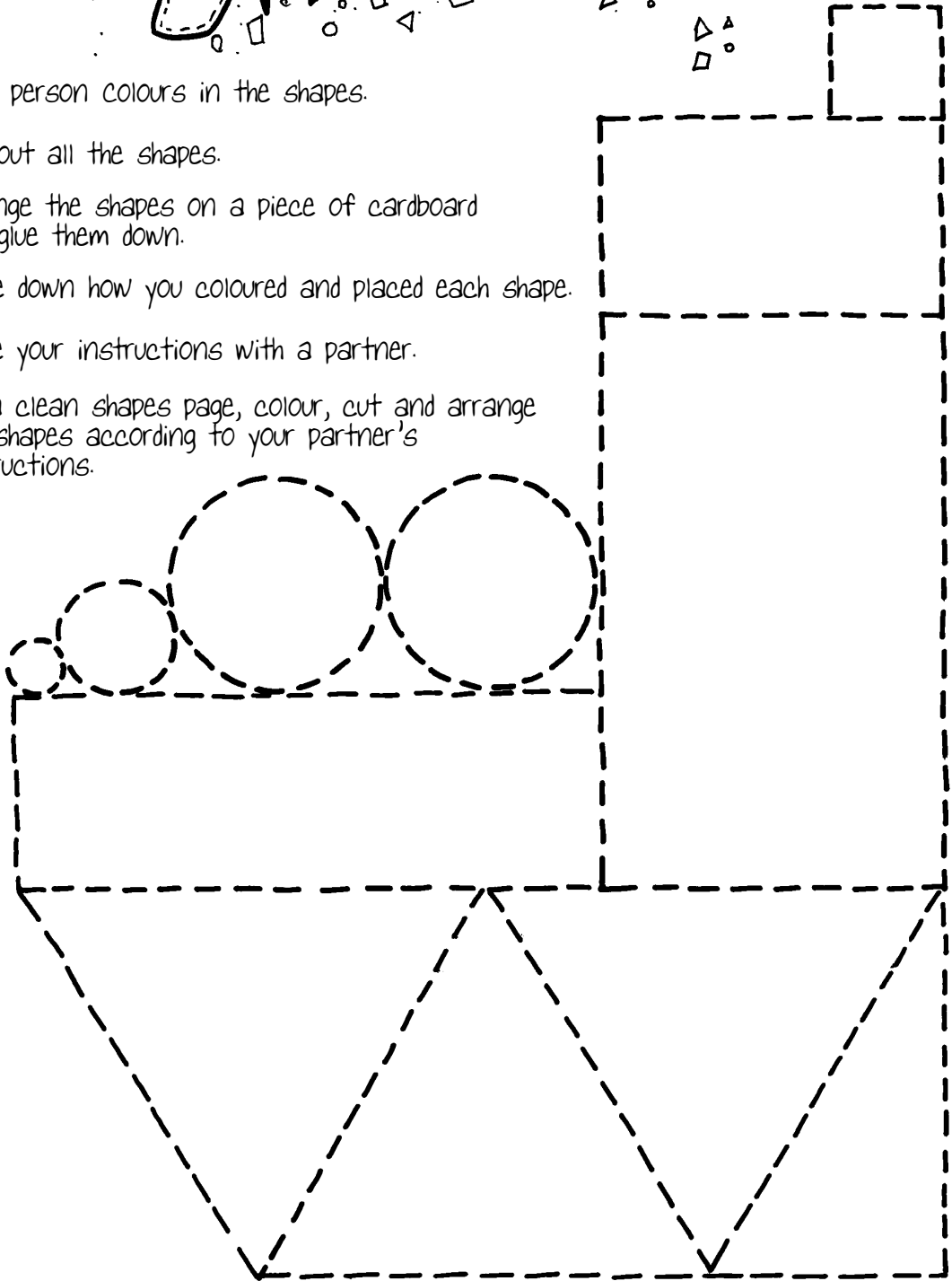
- Learn through reading, writing, discussing
- Communicate effectively, orally and in writing
- Display a rich vocabulary
- Write clearly
- Spell easily
- Think in words, play with words
- Love to tell stories or jokes
- Enjoy poetry
- Communicate with colourful and descriptive phrases
- Play word games
- Like to put thoughts on paper in letters, journals or creative writing
- Remember quotes and sayings





Steps

- 1 Each person colours in the shapes.
- 2 Cut out all the shapes.
- 3 Arrange the shapes on a piece of cardboard and glue them down.
- 4 Write down how you coloured and placed each shape.
- 5 Trade your instructions with a partner.
- 6 On a clean shapes page, colour, cut and arrange the shapes according to your partner's instructions.
