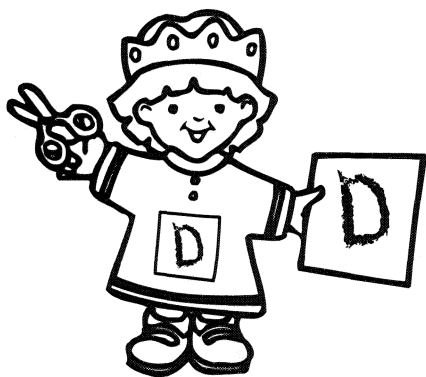


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# Introduction

Reinforce alphabet skills with the cut and paste worksheets, mini-posters and puzzles.

## Cut and Paste Worksheets

Provide crayons, scissors and glue for children to complete worksheets (pages 7–24).

## Cut and Paste Posters

Provide children with crayons, scissors and glue to complete mini-posters (pages 25–50). Display completed posters in your classroom.

## I Can Cut and Paste Booklets

Make construction paper folders to store each child's cut and paste worksheets. Provide each child with a booklet cover (pages 5–6) to colour, cut out and paste to the front of their folder. Write each child's first initial and name on the cover. Cut off the tops of completed worksheets and staple the lower parts inside folders to display at open day.

## Alphabet Puzzle Gallery

Reproduce one puzzle board (page 64) on sturdy paper for each child. Provide each child with crayons, a puzzle board and a cut and paste puzzle (pages 51–63). Show children how to colour, cut apart, assemble and glue the puzzle pieces to the puzzle board. Display completed puzzles on an Alphabet Puzzle Gallery bulletin board in your classroom.

## An Alphabet Picnic (cover)

Prepare a picnic area with a blanket and a picnic or other type of basket filled with cut and paste puzzles and puzzle board place mats for a skills practice centre. Reproduce the cut and paste puzzles and four puzzle boards (pages 51–64) on sturdy paper. Colour and cut out the puzzle pieces in puzzle boards. Store matching puzzle pieces in separate resealable plastic bags. Colour four large sheets of construction paper to resemble checkered picnic place mats. Glue the puzzle boards to the place mats. Store the place mats and puzzles in the basket. Encourage children to work in pairs to assemble and identify the picture and the beginning letter sound for each completed puzzle.
