

## Painting and Sculpture

### RESEARCH QUESTIONS

1. In a dictionary, find the following words: *detail*, *crafted*, *sculpture*, *hire*, *perspective*, *festival*, *military*, *decoration*, *scene*, *attractive*, and *advanced*. Define each word and use it in a sentence.
2. Look at pictures of the walls from Egyptian tombs. In the Egyptian style of drawing, sketch a scene from your life for your tomb.
3. Find out more about *two-point perspective*. Present your findings to the class and include drawings of two-point perspective to illustrate your speech.



### PROJECTS

1. Make your own model of Nefertiti's head using modeling clay.
2. Use a plastic knife to carve an Egyptian object from a bar of soap, such as a mummy or a fishing boat.
3. A *cartouche* is a tablet with a border, used as a nameplate. Using Egyptian symbols, make a cartouche for your own name.
4. You are a sculptor in ancient Egypt. The pharaoh orders you to design a statue that will guard the entrance to his tomb, similar to the Sphinx, but of your own design. Draw the design for the statue.
