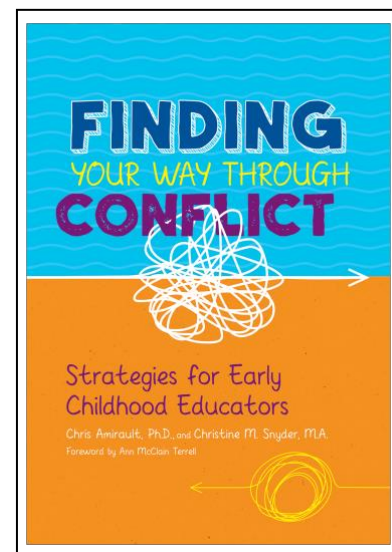


Finding your way through conflict
