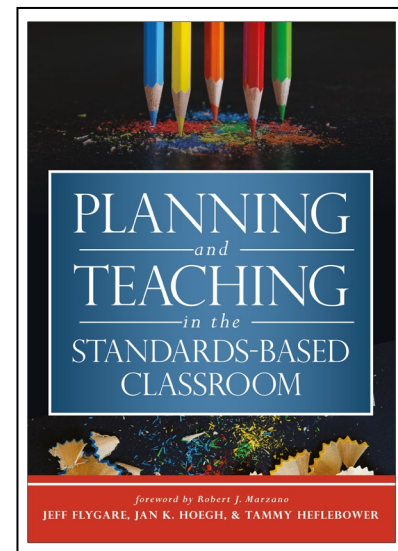


# Planning and teaching in the standards-based classroom
