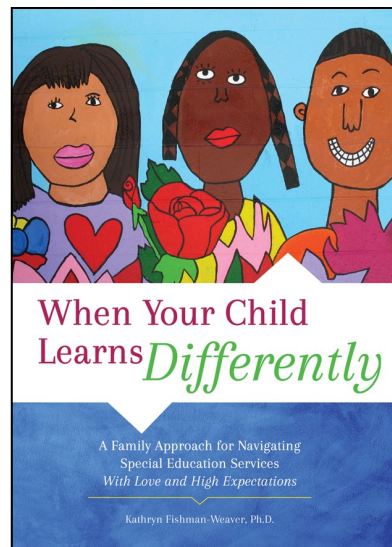


When Your Child Learns Differently: A Family Approach for Navigating Special Education Services with Love and High Expectations
