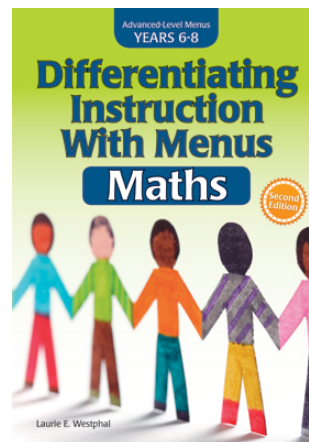


Differentiating Instruction With Menus: Maths (Years 6–8), 2nd Edition
