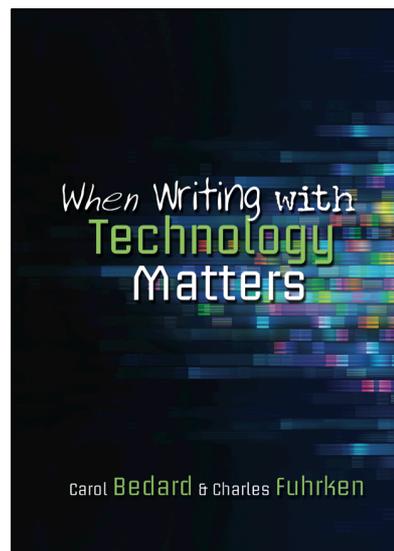


When Writing with Technology Matters

Summary

Students today have been plugged in for their entire lives. They don't remember a time before Facebook, blogs, texting and websites, and they have experienced a range of digital tools including laptops, smartphones and tablets. But writing in the classroom has not kept pace with the digital learner; there is a profound gap between what student learn in school and the skills they need to thrive in the twenty-first century.

When Writing with Technology Matters provides teachers with theory that supports the need for technology in classrooms and strategies on how to integrate technology into the English curriculum. This timely book addresses twenty-first century themes – critical thinking, collaboration, engagement and empowerment – and targets current educational foci – genre knowledge, research, the importance of process and the need to make learning relevant.

They also provide detailed descriptions of primary and middle years literacy projects that teachers can follow step-by-step or use as a guide when planning their own technology-based projects.
