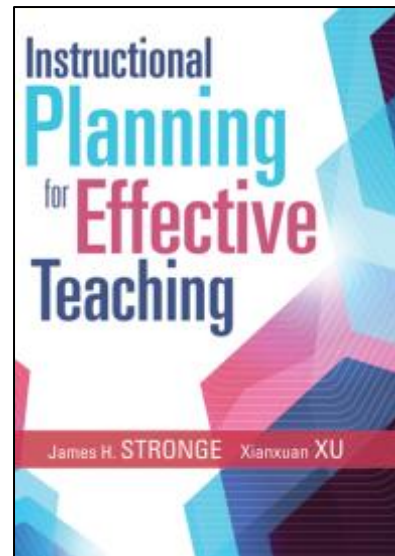


Instructional Planning for Effective Teaching
